



Yanda Log Cabin Marked as a Historical Site

A large group, including almost thirty descendants of the William Yanda Family, gathered in Glen Carbon Saturday, June 2nd as members of the Illinois State Society of the National Society Colonial Dames XVII Century recognized Glen Carbon's Yanda Log Cabin as a local historical site. Illinois State Society President, Linda Mizell, presided over the proceedings. The Glen Carbon Historical and Museum Commission hosted the event.



The plaque reads:

"The Yanda Log Cabin was built in 1853 by Austrian immigrant William Yanda, a Blacksmith. The family owned the property for at least three generations, including Frank Yanda, Jr. an early mayor. This cabin was restored in 1992 by Glen Carbon volunteers. Placed by Illinois State Society, National Society Colonial Dames XVII Century. June 2, 2018"
