Colonial Dames will be in attendance at this historical event.

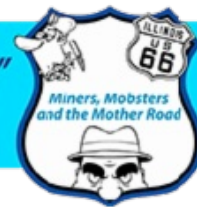
Built in 1853 by William Yanda, an immigrant from Austria,

business served the many travelers through the area on the
